## **Ice Show Date Continued...**

Some examples of jobs that we will need assistance with are:

- Costume Coordination
  - o We have a room full of costumes, but it takes a team to organize and distribute them all to our skaters
- Costume Making
  - o If any parents have a knack for sewing and would be interested in making a few shirts/pants or skirts – please let an executive member know
- Dressing Room Supervisors
  - o With most of our executive busy on the ice, in the lobby or announcing, it is hard to keep track of each and every skater throughout the show – ideally we would like 1 or 2 parents for each level per show (they would switch so that all parents would be able to watch one of the two shows) to ensure that all skaters are dressed and where they need to be in the stands to be ready for their next number
- Decorations and Props
  - o The club has many props that we re-use year after year but, if we have any parents who enjoy arts and crafts and would be willing to track down or build/create some decorations or props for the show, our club would greatly appreciate your time and effort
- Set up
  - o Often the executive members and their families are at the rink until midnight on the Friday before the show preparing the boards, setting up lights, ensuring dressing rooms and costumes are in order, testing the sound system, etc. The more hands that show up to help – the quicker and smoother the process will go.
- Spot Light Operators
  - o This job is often taken on by dads and brothers as the spot lights tend to be a bit heavy to handle at times. Anyone willing to operate a spot light for a show is encouraged to let an executive member know ASAP.
